



ATTENTION PARENTS:2024 -2025 Transportation Reimbursement Form

By May 15, 2024, our school office must submit a list of students to the school districts who provide transportation reimbursement. The Milwaukee County Transit System provides regularly scheduled routes to Southridge Mall and Walmart. Students who have access to the city bus service will have transportation available from early morning until late at night.

At ML, offering everyone a safe and secure environment is a top priority, and we aim to remain at the forefront of security best practices with your student in mind. As such, we have various safety measures already in place, like:

- Regular practice safety drills
- Campus-wide canine searches
- Alarm-connected doors at entrances
- Security cameras across campus
- Visitor background checks in the main office upon arrival
- ML Security officers present throughout the day
- A dedicated School Resource Officer (SRO) from the Greendale Police Department

In short, we have taken and will continue to take intentional, proactive, and meaningful steps to make ML a safe and secure place for students, staff members, families, and guests.

We continue to reflect upon, update, and enforce our policies and procedures. As part of this ongoing safety commitment, ML will implement the EVOLV weapons detection system this spring. We have successfully used this system at our high-attendance events and will operate it multiple days a week for all visitors. Like those used at concerts and sporting events, the EVOLV system will provide an additional layer of safety. We appreciate your understanding and patience as we perfect our implementation, intending to use it daily starting next school year.

We deeply value your understanding, patience, and partnership in our ongoing efforts to improve school safety. Our community's vigilance and cooperation are crucial in maintaining a safe environment for all. We are truly blessed to have such a supportive community!

If you have any questions or need further clarification on these important matters, please do not hesitate to contact me directly. I am here to ensure you are fully informed and comfortable with our safety measures.

Please also continue to pray for our school ministry and all our partner schools. May the Lord bless them with safe and welcoming spaces where young people can thrive, learn, and grow in life and faith in Jesus Christ!

Martin Luther High School FORMAL DANCE DRESS CODE GUIDELINES

The prom and other Martin Luther dances are school events and reflect the values and standards of our school. ML's Dress Code will be strictly enforced at all formal dances and must be followed by all students attending - both ML students and their guests. Anyone not in compliance with the Dress Code will not be admitted to the dance and refunds will not be issued. There is no loaner clothing

option. If you are bringing a date from another school, it is your responsibility to make him/her aware of the ML Dress Code. ML Dress Code requires attire that reflects modesty and good taste. Dance dress should not only be modest and appropriate, but also fit properly and be neat and clean. All students are expected to be well-groomed and reflect good personal hygiene. Following popular fashion trends will likely result in violations of our Dress Code. There are, however, hundreds of beautiful, tasteful, and appropriate dresses that are perfect for formal dances. If you have questions about your dress, it is your responsibility to seek prior approval from the administration. *Please see Mrs. Herbig, Dr. Jensen or Mr. Wollersheim before purchasing a dress that you might not be able to wear or return.* You can avoid violations and being subject to disciplinary action by leaning towards modesty. These guidelines may be helpful reminders of ML's Dress Code as applied to formal dances, including the prom.

As with clothing allowed to school, no displays or suggestions of obscene language or symbols, pornography, violence, gang affiliation; illegal drugs, alcohol, or tobacco; or symbols of death are permitted.

The school administration has the final judgment in determining compliance with the Dress Code and making the subjective determination of modesty. Students are advised to err on the side of modesty and formality. Please do not put school administrators in the difficult position of upholding school standards or let yourself or your date be embarrassed by being called out for violating our school's dress code and asked to leave the dance.

Men

- Men are expected to wear formal evening attire that could include a tuxedo, suit with a tie, or sport coat and slacks with a tie. (Dark blue or black jeans that are free from holes and tears are acceptable.)
- Shirts must be worn and be buttoned and collared.
- No bandannas, baseball caps, or other hats or headwear are allowed.
- Shoes should be dress shoes or nice athletic shoes.







Women

- Necklines of a dress, top, or gown must be cut in a modest way so that no/limited cleavage is shown.
- No exposed undergarments or sleepwear.
- Sides must cover the torso, chest should be no lower than a normal bra strap. Cut-outs are acceptable on the back ONLY.
- NO exposure of chest, midriff, thigh, naval or abdomen. Sheer panels
 on dresses are not allowed and will not make your dress meet dress
 code requirements.
- Slits in a dress/skirt or non-sheer areas must be at least a 5 inch inseam.
- The garment should not be excessively tight.
- No removable cover-ups (coats, shawls, sweaters) will be allowed over dresses that do not meet the Dress Code. Any additions pinned or sewn onto a dress to make it compliant with the dress code must remain in place throughout the dance.
- Remember, because of differing body types, the same dress may be acceptable on one person, but not on another.

ORDER TICKETS



Regular attendance at school is essential for successful earning of credits. The school day has priority over outside activities. We understand that absences happen and are sometimes unavoidable. When a student misses school, it puts the student and the teacher in a difficult situation. Education takes place in the classroom and cannot always be made up outside of the classroom.

As we are now halfway through the second semester, this a reminder that course credit may be forfeited for excessive absences, excused or unexcused. You may have received communication from a teacher regarding this policy. Below is the policy as stated in the handbook on page 12.

5.1 THE ATTENDANCE POLICY IS AS FOLLOWS:

A. Course credit may be forfeited on the seventeenth period of absence in a semester course.

Please use Skyward to check your student's attendance. If your student will be absent, please use the following procedures for notifying the front office.

5.2 PROCEDURE TO FOLLOW WHEN AN ABSENCE OCCURS:

A. If a student must miss a school day for an illness or will be arriving later in the morning because of an appointment, please remember: On the day of the absence, parents/emergency contacts should call the school office by 9:00 AM.

- **B.** If a student needs to leave school during the day for any reason, parents/emergency contacts ONLY are to send a note with the student or call the office that morning. <u>Last</u> minute calls may result in a delayed dismissal. Students are then given a pass to leave.
- **C.** If a student will be out of school for an extended time, they need to pick up a Pre-Planned Absence Form from the office. This form must be signed by the parents, all of the student's teachers, guidance counselor and the principal. Also, a note should be sent to the office.
- **D**. In some cases, a doctor's statement may be required before students are permitted to return to class. This is particularly true in the event of communicable diseases or prolonged absences. The office will notify parents when this requirement is necessary.
- **E.** Participants must be in attendance for HALF of the school day to participate in practice or contests on that day. If a personal absence occurs for any part of the day, school administration must excuse the absence to allow a student to participate in a practice or contest.
- **F.** All absences must be accounted for by the home.
- **G.** Parents who leave students under the supervision of another caretaker while out of town, must leave the following information with the school: duration of their absence. name and phone number of person assuming responsibility for the student

Wisconsin Tax Deduction

Beginning with the tax year 2014, the State of Wisconsin introduced legislation (Wis. Stat. § 71.05(6)(b)49), in which private school tuition payments paid on or after January 1, 2014 are eligible for an annual income tax deduction. Qualified taxpayers may potentially claim up to the deduction limit (\$4,000) for each dependent child in grades Kindergarten through 8th and up to the

deduction limit (\$10,000) for each dependent child in grades 9th through 12th. Tuition claimed must be paid in the tax year in which it is being filed.

Finalsite

For any payments made for the tax year, you will need to access the tax form from <u>Finalsite</u> (<u>formerly called SchoolAdmin</u>). To obtain your tuition payments, log into your Finalsite account and click the billing tab. The tax statement is a link located within the ledger header. For more information on how to claim these expenses, click on the Wisconsin Department of Revenue form: <u>Schedule PS - Private School Tuition</u>. In preparing the form, taxpayers will need our **FEIN which is 39-0889672**, as well as the amount of tuition paid last year.

Unsure when you should seek therapy services for your child? Here are just a few signs it may be time to seek counseling:

- Your child may be isolating, withdrawing
- Your child may not seem interested in things they once were interested in or they seem to have low energy
- They spend all their time on devices and/or video games and are not wanting to spend time with family or friends or the activities they enjoy
- They may have had a sudden change or gradual change in behavior
- They may not want to hang out with friends like they used to
- Their grades are declining

- You may receive calls home from school due to their behavior
- They seem more on edge, irritable, like something is constantly bothering them
- They have recently lost a loved one or pet
- They had a serious incident happen to them or someone they love

The lack of an announcement means that school will be operating.

Information on SMS text messaging and Short Codes:

SMS stands for Short Message Service and is commonly referred to as a "text message". Most cell phones support this type of text messaging. Our notification provider. SchoolfMessenger, uses a true SMS protocol developed by the telecommunications industry specifically for mass text messaging, referred to as "short code" texting. This method is fast, secure and highly reliable because it is strictly regulated by the wireless carriers and only allows access to approved providers if you've ever sent a text vote for a TV show to a number like 46999, you have used short code texting.

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
