

Homecoming Dance is Saturday 7/23 from 7pm-10pm. PLEASE BE PROMPT when picking up your student. Students are released from the dance starting at 9:45pm (freshmen), 9:50pm (sophomore), 9:55pm (juniors), 10:05pm (seniors).



FORMAL DANCE DRESS CODE GUIDELINES

The prom and other Martin Luther dances are school events and reflect the values and standards of our school. ML's Dress Code will be strictly enforced at

all formal dances and must be followed by all students attending - both ML students and their guests. Anyone not in compliance with the Dress Code will not be admitted to the dance and refunds will not be issued. There is no loaner clothing option. If you are bringing a date from another school, it is your responsibility to make him/her aware of the ML Dress Code. ML Dress Code requires attire that reflects modesty and good taste. Dance dress should not only be modest and appropriate, but also fit properly and be neat and clean. All students are expected to be well-groomed and reflect good personal hygiene. Following popular fashion trends will likely result in violations of our Dress Code. There are, however, hundreds of beautiful, tasteful, and appropriate dresses that are perfect for formal dances. If you have questions about your dress, it is your responsibility to seek prior approval from the administration. Please see Mrs. Herbig, Dr. Jensen or Mr. Wollersheim before purchasing a dress that you might not be able to wear or return. You can avoid violations and being subject to disciplinary action by leaning towards modesty. These guidelines may be helpful reminders of ML's Dress Code as applied to formal dances, including the prom.

As with clothing allowed to school, no displays or suggestions of obscene language or symbols, pornography, violence, gang affiliation; illegal drugs, alcohol, or tobacco; or symbols of death are permitted.

The school administration has the final judgment in determining compliance with the Dress Code and making the subjective determination of modesty. Students are advised to err on the side of modesty and formality. Please do not put school administrators in the difficult position of upholding school standards or let yourself or your date be embarrassed by being called out for violating our

school's dress code and asked to leave the dance.

MEN

- Men are expected to wear formal evening attire that could include a tuxedo, suit with a tie, or sport coat and slacks with a tie. (Dark blue or black jeans that are free from holes and tears are acceptable.)
- Shirts must be worn and be buttoned and collared.
- No bandannas, baseball caps, or other hats or headwear are allowed.
- Shoes should be dress shoes or nice athletic shoes.

WOMEN

- Necklines of a dress, top, or gown must be cut in a modest way so that no/limited cleavage is shown.
- No exposed undergarments or sleepwear.
- Sides must cover the torso, chest should be no lower than a normal bra strap. Cut-outs are acceptable on the back ONLY.
- NO exposure of chest, midriff, thigh, naval or abdomen. Sheer panels on dresses are not allowed and will not make your dress meet dress code requirements.
- Slits in a dress/skirt or non-sheer areas must be at least a 5 inch inseam.
- The garment should not be excessively tight.
- No removable cover-ups (coats, shawls, sweaters) will be allowed over dresses that do not meet the Dress Code. Any additions pinned or sewn onto a dress to make it compliant with the dress code must remain in place throughout the dance.
- Remember, because of differing body types, the same dress may be acceptable on one person, but not on another.

Monday, Sept. 25 - Virtual Day for ALL students, THIS IS A REGULAR DAY OF SCHOOL:

- Students need to check Schoology for directions from ALL teachers. It is possible that project based classes (Art, Woods, Sewing, etc) may not have work to be completed for the day.
- Just as a in person school day, you may have homework outside of the regular school day (8am-3:15pm). All assignments will be open and need to be submitted by 11:59pm on 9/25. No makeup work for Virtual Day will be allowed.
- If you are ill on Monday and unable to complete work because of illness, your parent/guardian should follow normal attendance procedures (call the office to let them know).
- If a teacher chooses and communicates that they will be doing a live lesson, they will also record it, but the live lesson will take place during normal class time. (i.e. 3rd Period 10:17-10:59)

 Attendance is not based on the live lesson.
- All lessons and assignments will be on Schoology, but the Office App may be needed to complete any word documents, PPT, etc. (the Office App is available on your mobile device app store if you do not have a computer)
- Teachers will communicate expectations for their individual classes and office hours they will have on Monday before you leave for the weekend.
- Passwords will not be given on Monday. Make sure you have all passwords and apps in order before you leave school on Friday. Not having your password is not a valid reason for missing work.







Greetings Parents/Guardians,

Voice mail messages regarding attendance can be left on the school office voice mail 414-421-4000, Ext. 0, or emails may be sent - AttendanceML@martinlutherhs.org - at any time of the day or night. The school office opens at 7:30 AM, and office staff are available to take phone calls. Parents/guardians may, also, notify the office staff in advance for absences, appointments, etc. by sending a note with your student or calling the office.

ATTENDANCE REMINDERS:

- When a student must miss a school day for an illness, funeral, etc., or will be arriving later in
 the morning because of an appointment, please remember: On the day of the absence, parents
 should call the school office by 9:00 AM, 414-421-4000, or send an email to
 AttendanceML@martinlutherhs.org. Parents will receive an automated phone call if a student
 is absent for 1 or more class periods. Once we receive a return call from a parent/guardian, the
 student's absence will be marked. If we do not receive a return phone call/email, the absence
 will remain as "unexcused truant".
- When a student arrives late to school, they must stop by the tardy kiosk in the lobby. After 8:30 am, they must come to the school office, and a parent/guardian must call the office. (Please ensure your student arrives to school with enough time to get to their lockers and get to their 1st hour classroom before 8:00a.m.). If a parent/guardian has not contacted the office regarding their student's late arrival, the student's attendance will be marked as "tardy". If a student arrives 20 minutes late, their attendance will be marked as "unexcused truant" unless a parent/guardian has contacted the office.
- If a student has a doctor appointment, they must have a doctor's excuse to return to school.
 Otherwise, it will be an unexcused absence.
- If a student needs to leave school during the day for any reason, please call the school office AT LEAST ONE HOUR IN ADVANCE. Last minute calls will result in a delayed dismissal.
- If a student becomes ill during the school day, they must come to the school office, and the
 office staff will promptly contact the parent/guardian. A Permit To Leave Campus will then be
 given to the student.
- If a student will be out of school for an extended time, they need to pick up a Pre-Planned
 Absence Form from the office. This form must be signed by the parents, all of the student's
 teachers, guidance counselor and the principal. Also, a note should be sent to the office.

Students who miss class 17 or more times, may forfeit course credit

<u>Please Note</u>: For the safety of our students, faculty and staff and only essential visitors will be allowed in the building during the school day. If you are picking up your student, please refrain from coming into the building. Thank you for your cooperation.

Mental Health Counseling

Lutheran Counseling and Family Services (LCFS) is providing mental health counseling once a week here at SCHOOL!

Unsure when you should seek therapy services for your child? Here are just a few signs it may be time to seek counseling:

- Your child may be isolating, withdrawing
- Your child may not seem interested in things they once were interested in or they seem to have low energy
- They spend all their time on devices and/or video games and are not wanting to spend time with family or friends or the activities they enjoy
- They may have had a sudden change or gradual change in behavior
- They may not want to hang out with friends like they used to
- Their grades are declining
- You may receive calls home from school due to their behavior
- They seem more on edge, irritable, like something is constantly bothering them
- They have recently lost a loved one or pet
- They had a serious incident happen to them or someone they love If you are considering whether counseling is right for your child, LCFS's counselor Tina Popp can meet with you to answer any questions you may have. Please ask Mrs. Hammerling, chammerling@martinlutherhs.org for a packet.

Athletics Digital Tickets and Season Passes

To begin the 2023-2024 school year, Martin Luther athletics has moved to digital tickets and season passes only for all our home athletic events for which we charge admission for: (basketball (all levels), track, volleyball (all levels), varsity football, and all WIAA tournament events). We experienced success with fully digital ticketing in the second semester of last year and we are excited to move to it fully this year and beyond. We will no longer accept cash

at any of our home athletic events. All tickets will be sold through the Martin Luther Athletics page sponsored by Ticket Spicket. This decision was made based on the suggestion and collaboration of the Martin Luther administration team. Please see below additional information regarding our home game ticketing policies.

Home Game Ticket Purchasing for (basketball (all levels), track, volleyball (all levels), varsity football, and all WIAA tournament events)

All tickets must be purchased online. We will no longer accept cash at any of our home athletic events for ticket sales. Individual game tickets and season/full year passes can be purchased at http://spicket.events/martinluther

Individual game tickets will go on sale 1 week before each event's start date.

When arriving at the event your ticket QR code will be scanned on your mobile device. You can either show us your ticket QR code on your cellular device to be scanned, or you can print your tickets at home to be scanned at the gate.

For all games, ticket sales and gates will close 30 minutes after the scheduled start time of the varsity game the day of the event. Sales will close at halftime for football only. (This is subject to change for larger events and will be communicated ahead of time).

Any individual not in the event 30 minutes after the schedule start time of the game, will not be allowed to enter whether they have purchased a ticket or not. (Halftime for football games).

Refunds will only be issued for canceled events that will not be rescheduled. No refunds will be given for any other reason.

There will be no re-entry upon exiting the event. Once an individual leaves, they will not be allowed back into the event.

All middle/elementary school students must be accompanied by an adult. Any middle/elementary students not accompanied by an adult will not be allowed into the game. The cost of an elementary/middle school ticket is \$2 and must be purchased online.

Passes

 ML Individual and Family season or full year passes can be purchased online and must be scanned for every event. http://spicket.events/martinluther

- Metro Classic Conference, Midwest Classic Conference, Woodland and Capital North paper card passes for Football ONLY are still allowed at the gate, a digital ticket is not required.
- Metro Classic Conference ONLY paper card passes for girls' volleyball, basketball and track are still allowed at the gate, a digital ticket is not required.
- ML alumni passes, special youth night passes and LHSAGM passes paper card passes are still allowed at the gate, a digital ticket is not required.

Children 6 and under are free with an adult, no ticket is required for the child.

Martin Luther students are allowed in for free with their student ID. No student ID means no admittance.

Any Martin Luther staff member will be permitted into the game free with their school ID, no digital ticket will be required. Anyone else accompanying a Martin Luther staff member (spouse, friends, children, etc.) will require a digital ticket.

Please note for WIAA tournament events everyone will be required to have a digital ticket as WIAA does not allow passes or free admission.
